There is no check-in: Verifying your dog's NADAC registration number is your responsibility. You may pick up your dog's entry toy any time during the day. Please, one toy per dog.

Measurement: Dogs **under 18"**, entered in **proficient**, and **without a permanent height cards must be measured before they run. I will contact you and arrange for measurement if your dog falls into this category.** Dogs entered in skilled DO NOT have to be measured.

First dog on the line will be at 8 AM each day.

Entry Rules: We will accept entries postmarked on September 8, 2008, or later, until either the maximum number of runs per day is reached or the closing date of September 19, 2008, whichever comes first. Spaces in this trial will be allotted in postmark order, not in the order of receipt by the Trial Secretary. If more entries with the opening date postmark are received than the total number of slots available, priority entry will be given to a limited number of exhibitors who volunteer to help at the trial. The remaining slots will be drawn from randomly selected entries. If the trial fills on a subsequent date, the drawing will be made from all entries. Any entry that is not accompanied by payment in full will be considered invalid. We have the right to refuse any entry. Anyone who is not currently in good standing with NADAC will not be allowed entry into the trial.

AWARDS: Purple rosettes will be awarded for all qualifying runs. Ribbons will be awarded for 1st through 6th place in each jump height in Novice classes. Ribbons will be awarded for 1st through 4th place for each jump height and class for all other levels. Chances is pass/no pass and thus no placement ribbons will be awarded.

THE MANAGEMENT will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dog exhibited, or for the possessions of any exhibitor, whether the result was by accident or any other cause. It is distinctly understood that every dog at this event is in the care and custody and control of his owner or handler during the entire time the dog is on the show premises. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of fees paid will be made.

Please make sure your dog's NADAC registration number is correct!!

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

This trial is sanctioned by the North American Dog Agility Council (NADAC). **Exhibitors, through submission of their entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of NADAC rules and regulations and relevant WAG policies, including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry, and agree to abide by all rules in effect at the time of this trial.**

Dogs must be registered and have a valid registration number before entries will be accepted. NADAC registration forms can be obtained at the NADAC website, or dogs can be registered online to immediately receive a permanent registration number. Go to www.nadac.com (click on "Dogs" on the home page) or contact the Trial Secretary.

Current Jump Height Table, Breed Exemption List, description of classes, levels and divisions are included in the current NADAC Exhibitor's Handbook. A copy of the current Exhibitor's Handbook may be downloaded for free from the NADAC website (www.nadac.com). Or Exhibitors may request a hard copy of the current Exhibitor's Handbook from: North American Dog Agility Council, PO Box 1206, Colbert, OK 74733-1206.

Exhibitors may contact NADAC at info@nadac.com with general questions or for information.

- All dogs must be on leash when not competing in the ring.
- No leads, collars, food, toys, or other aids or devices will be permitted on the course at any time.
- Checks not honored by the bank do not constitute a valid entry fee.
- There will be a \$20.00 service charge for bank returned checks.
- There will be no refunds in the event that a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for dismissal. Checks will be held until closing date.
- 100% of entry fees will be refunded if requested before the closing date. After the closing date, injured or ill handlers or injured, ill or in-heat dogs will receive a refund, less a \$20.00 handling fee. Verification from a doctor or vet may be requested.
- Running order will be determined at the club's discretion. An attempt will be made to separate runs for handlers with more than one dog in a class.
- There will be no refunds for withdrawals requested on or after the first competition date listed in this premium, regardless of the reason.

Non-Jumping Classes—Veteran or Disabled Handler. Handlers who are 60 years or older, or who have a disability that restricts mobility, may choose to enter the non-jumping classes as a Veteran Handler and receive 10% more standard course time. This option is for Veteran/Disabled handlers in the non-jumping classes only. The Veteran/Disabled Handler division is designed for handlers who, due to age or impairment, are mobility limited and need extra time to guide their canine partners through an agility course. When entering as a Veteran/Disabled Handler, you must enter all dogs in all classes for the entire trial in this Division and must jump 4" lower than your Proficient, Standard Division jump height requires. In the non-jumping classes, dogs will be scored and placed with their Standard Division jump height

EQUIPMENT. Rubber matted contact equipment will be used in both rings. The safety/displaceable tire will also be used.

IMPORTANT. Please check your dog's NADAC registration number on your trial confirmation as soon as you receive it; also, please check the copy of the results posted at the trial. You should report any errors to the Trial Secretary immediately.

NADAC records trial results as they are submitted by the host clubs/groups. The individual trial results submitted by the club are uploaded to the files section of the NADACagility@yahoogle.com list within two weeks after the NADAC office receives them from the club. The trial results will remain on the list for at least thirty (30) days. Please accept the responsibility to review those results, and check that your registration number and qualifying points, as reported by the club, are correct. You can join the www.NADACagility@yahoogle.com list and set your settings to "no mail". You will be able to view trial results and check for any possible discrepancies, without receiving list mail. If you find an error in the reporting of your dog's qualifying points or registration number, please contact the host club. The host club is responsible for correcting any errors and informing NADAC.

Levels. Points earned at a higher level of a class, prior to the completion of the lower level title, will not be banked by NADAC for future use. If a dog earns points in a level of a class that they are not eligible to title in, those points will not be added to the dog's records.

SKILLED AND PROFICIENT CATEGORIES

Dogs must be entered in either the Skilled or the Proficient category. A dog may not be entered in Skilled one day and Proficient on another day. Dogs may enter the Skilled or Proficient category in the Standard, Veteran, or Junior Handler Division.

If you enter the Skilled category, you may choose to run your dog at one jump height lower than its standard jump height. **You must indicate on your entry form that you wish to run your dog 4" lower by checking the height your dog will actually jump in the jumping classes.** (Four inches will remain the minimum jump height.) Dogs are allotted the standard course time for, and are scored and placed, in the jump height entered.

AGREEMENT

The person who signs this agreement represents that he/she is authorized to enter into this agreement on behalf of both exhibitor and the owner of entered dog. In consideration of acceptance of this entry:

- 1.1 As used here NADAC means North American Dog Agility Council, its members, officers, employees, show chairs, show committees and agents.
- 1.2 Exhibitor/owner, agree to abide by the rules and regulations of NADAC and any other rules and regulations appearing in the premium for this event.
- 1.3 Exhibitor/owner certify that the entered dog is not a hazard to persons, dogs or property and that the entered dog's rabies vaccination is current in accordance with the requirement of the state in which the dog resides.
- 1.4 Exhibitor/owner acknowledge all hazards presented by the event and the event premises, including but not limited to, the condition of the fields, floors, stairways, halls, lighting, security measures or lack of, electrical appliances, fitting, show rings, parking areas and the presence of unfamiliar animals and people; exhibitor and owner assume the risk of any harm arising from these.
- 1.5 Exhibitor/owner release NADAC (including NADAC officers, employees and members), WAG (including its officers directors, members, and event organizing committee), and the Lincoln County School District (including its officers, agents, and employees) and will defend them and hold them harmless from all present and future loss, injury, damage, claims, demands and liabilities involving the entered dog, the event or event premises. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing hold harmless provisions, exhibitor/owner hereby specifically assume sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expenses (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the afore-mentioned parties for damages because of bodily injuries, including death, at any time in consequences of my (our) participation in this event, howsoever such injury or death may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused or may have been alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents or any other persons.
- 1.6 I(We) acknowledge that by entering this class or event, I am or will be, a Limited Member of the Willamette Agility Group.

In consideration of the acceptance of the entry, I/we certify that I/we have knowledge of, and are familiar with, and agree to abide by the rules and regulations of NADAC and WAG in effect at the time of this trial, and by any additional rules and regulations as approved by NADAC and WAG for this trial. I/we certify that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. I/We further agree by our signature on the official entry form of this premium to be bound by this "agreement".

DIRECTIONS TO TRIAL SITE

Benton County Fairgrounds - 110 SW 53rd Street, Corvallis, OR

Take 1-5 to Exit 228 (Hwy 34 to Corvallis). As you enter Corvallis, Hwy 34 becomes Harrison Blvd. Remain on Harrison through Corvallis to 53rd Street. Turn south (left) onto 53rd Street (Walnut Blvd. becomes 53rd at the light). Benton County Fairgrounds is approximately 1/4 of a mile on the right.

Alternate route: As you approach Corvallis on Highway 34, do not cross the bridge into town, but turn LEFT at the light before the bridge; this takes you to the downtown bypass. Continue (west) to the light at 53rd St. (Bi-Mart will be on your left). Turn right (north) on to 53rd Street. The Fairgrounds are approximately 1/2 mile on the left.

VENDORS: Food vendor will be on site for Saturday and Sunday.

HELP FOR NEW COMPETITORS: WAG members will be available at this trial as helpers for competitors who are new to agility trials and would like to have someone to ask questions and have help on where to crate, what is happening, how do a find my score and what does it mean, etc... Look for the WAG members with special name tags. New competitors will also receive Information from the trial secretary about how to prepare for their first agility trial.

CRATING SPACE: In addition to space inside the arena building, the covered courtyard has been reserved for supplemental crating space.

DONATION: A percentage of the trial proceeds will be donated to a charity of the Trial Committee's choice.

VENDORS: If you would like to be a vendor at this trial, please contact Cheryl Henning (cherylhennig@juno.com) by Friday, October 10, 2008. The "fee" for vendor space is a \$25 donation in goods/services to the raffle or a payment of \$25, payable to WAG. Vendor space is limited and must be reserved in advance; priority for vendor space is given to those who are participating in the trial. For the safety and enjoyment of everyone at the trial, all vendors are asked to use a modest amount of space for their displays and to cooperate with WAG in the location of their space at the trial facility.

Each motel has its own prices and rules for dogs, and they vary widely between motels. Some motels have exceptions to their usual rules for 'show dogs'.

ON-SITE RV CAMPING

There are two types of on-site RV camping available at Benton County Fairgrounds (BCF) for the WAG trial. *Tent camping is not available on the dates of this trial.*

- 1) **\$20 per night:** This is a special WAG rate. Electrical hookups only; access to restrooms and showers. These spaces are at the front of the Fairgrounds near the arena where the trial is being held. This rate also applies to overnight camping or sleeping in any vehicle (car, truck, van).
- 2) **\$25 per night:** Electrical, water, cable and other goodies; access to restrooms and showers. These "deluxe" spaces are somewhat farther away on concrete slabs with grass surrounds.

If you would like a \$20 per night space, mark the appropriate line on your trial entry form and send the additional \$20 per night to WAG with your entry fees. You will receive a camping tag by postal mail, which must be displayed in your camping rig. You are not allowed to park in the deluxe spots for this price. Available on a first-come, first-served basis; there are 25-30 of these spaces.

If you would like a \$25 deluxe space, you must contact BCF directly at 541-766-6521, 766-6088, or 766-6089. BCF has told us to tell you that it is better to reserve the spot than wait and that your credit card does get charged when you reserve. With 24 hours notice BCF will refund your money via a County check.
