ENTRIES and CLOSING DATES

- **All entries must be received by Friday, February 13th.** Entries will be accepted by postal mail or by express courier with the signature requirement waived. No email or telephone entries will be accepted. There is no limit to the number of dogs that can participate in this agility trial. You may request a change in class or cancel your entry in writing (letter or email) any time prior to or on the closing date of February 13.
- The secondary closing for advancement in level only is Friday, February 27th; secondary closing is only for entries received by the closing date of Friday, February 13, 2009. Requests for advancement in level only must be received by the secondary closing date and must be made by postal mail, email or by express courier with the signature requirement waived. Only advancements in class level will be accepted; no changes in jump height or program will be accepted.
- If your dog has a yellow permanent height card, a copy may be submitted with your entry to expedite check-in. Copies of the blue temporary height cards cannot be accepted. You may contact the Secretary to determine if a copy your dog's yellow permanent height card is already on file with WAG.

CHECK-IN and MEASURING

- **All competitors are required to check in at this trial.** At check-in, you must present your yellow permanent height card, blue temporary height card or USDAA check-in letter. (If your confirmation letter says "Height Card On File: Yes" then you do not need to present your yellow card, but you must check in.)
- **Check-in and measuring will be from 7:15a to 7:45a Saturday and Sunday mornings.** We may offer early check-in on Friday evening for those whose dogs do not need to be measured; see your confirmation letter for details. Dogs and handlers that have checked in once at the trial do not need to check in again on subsequent days.
- **Junior Handler Program:** Check-in and measuring will be from 7:15a to 7:30a on Sunday morning; see your confirmation letter for details.
- **Dogs required to be measured:** Your dog must be measured by a judge at check-in if you do not have either a yellow permanent height card, a completed blue temporary height card awaiting a CMJ or a check-in letter issued by USDAA/print out of dog info page from subscriber account indicating the dog is permanently carded.
- All handlers for a given class should be present ringside at least one-half hour prior to the start of scheduled classes for walk-throughs and briefings.
- **First class will begin promptly at 8:00a on Saturday and Sunday.** Any dog and handler not present when they are called will be ineligible to run, unless prior arrangements are made with the gate steward. It is the handler's responsibility to review the gate sheet before a class begins and then to make arrangements with the gate steward if there is a conflict.

PRIZES and AWARDS

Standard/Non-Standard Classes – Championship and Performance

- **Starters and Performance I:** Separate 1st through 6th place ribbons will be awarded for placement in each jump height and class with Pairs being awarded to mini and open divisions. Maroon ribbons will be awarded for each qualifying run.
- **Advanced, Masters, Performance II, and Performance III; Grand Prix and Performance National Standard:** Separate 1st through 4th place ribbons will be awarded for placement in each jump height and class. Pairs will be awarded to mini and open divisions. Maroon ribbons will be awarded for each qualifying run.

ADCH and APD: If you might complete your Agility Dog Champion® or Accomplished Performance DogSM title at this trial, please notify the Secretary at least one week before the trial.

Junior Handler Program

Junior Handlers will receive awards at three levels: Gold, for performances yielding 5 or fewer faults; silver, for those with 15 or fewer, but more than 5 faults; bronze, for those with more than 15 faults. Maroon qualifying ribbons will be awarded for zero fault rounds.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Competitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA Rules and Regulations, as amended March 30, 2007, including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry. USDAA's official Rules and Regulations are hereby incorporated by reference, an electronic version of which may be accessed online at www.usdaa.com, Rules & Regulations.

- This test is open to all dogs being at least 18 months of age, including purebred and non-purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness that may affect the dog's ability to perform safely, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression.
- All dogs must be registered with USDAA in order to compete in USDAA sanctioned events. To obtain a registration number immediately and a height card prior to the show, go online to www.usdaa.com, General Information, Dog Registration. Registration may be made concurrently with entry to this show, a form for which is included in this Agility Test Schedule. Additionally, all junior handlers must be separately registered in order to compete in the Junior Handler Program classes. Registration number has a "J" prefix.
- Order of classes as listed on the cover of this Agility Test Schedule is not necessarily the running order. The tentative running order as listed in this Schedule may be changed.
- No leads, collars, food, toys or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course except as provided for in the USDAA Rules and Regulations for the Junior Handler Program. No training, pinch or shock collars will be permitted on or around the course at any time.
- Safety shall be of foremost consideration at all times. Handlers, through entry at this event, accept full responsibility for themselves, their guests and the actions of their dogs.
- The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee view that participation by competitor would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing entry and a brief explanation of the basis for the committee's decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee.
- No entries shall be accepted, changed, or altered after the closing date of Friday, February 13th, except as outlined under ENTRIES and CLOSING DATES.
- There shall be no refunds in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason.
- 100% of entry fees will be refunded if requested before or on the closing date of Friday, February 13th. Refunds for withdrawals requested after the closing date but before the first competition date listed in this Schedule will be made only for injured or ill handlers or injured, ill or in-season dogs. Owner/handler will receive a refund less a \$20 per dog handling fee. Verification from a doctor or vet may be requested.
- There shall be no refunds for withdrawals requested on or after the first competition date listed in this Schedule, regardless of the reason.
- **Checks will be held until the closing date of Friday, February 13th.** Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. There will be a \$20 service charge for returned checks. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls and the service charge must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is canceled without recourse by owner/handler. Where notification is received after event date, payment of entry fees and service charges shall be made in cash or money order within 30 days of postmark notice of returned check. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration number(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution.
- Dogs must remain on leash at all times, except when competing in the ring or in the warm-up jump area.
- No dogs may be left unattended except when properly kenneled in designated kennel areas. Day kenneling only is permitted, unless otherwise posted at the show site. USDAA and Willamette Agility Group cannot and do not assume any liability for loss of any items left unattended.
- No entry fees will be refunded if the Test cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, Act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strike or any other cause beyond the control of the organizers.
- Agility obstacles shall meet the requirements of USDAA Rules and Regulations.
- Dogs must be exercised only in designated areas. Please pick up after your dog.
- **Fault limits may be applied in all classes for which faults are assessed. Limits shall be announced during the judges' briefings.**
- Mismatched or incomplete Pairs shall be accepted as draw entries only.
- There will be no equipment familiarization at this event.
- **There shall be no smoking in the boundary of the show site, which shall include all buildings and entries to all buildings.**
- Competitors are advised that other public and private events may occur on the grounds of the show site on the same dates as this event. To ensure the continued availability of this site, competitors must conduct themselves in a responsible and respectful manner.
- All competitors, through entry at this event, waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast of this event. Competitors shall have the right to videotape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial or other purposes. All video, broadcast and telecast rights for this event are the exclusive property of United States Dog Agility Association, Inc.
- Portions of this event may be taped for television. Through entry at this event, ALL COMPETITORS and HANDLERS HEREBY GRANT to USDAA and its representatives, agents, and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media now known or hereafter to become known. All competitors and handlers hereby release USDAA and its representatives, agents, and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right.

DIRECTIONS TO SHOW SITE

Benton County Fairgrounds, 110 SW 53rd Street, Corvallis, OR

Take I-5 to Exit 228 (Hwy. 34 to Corvallis). As you enter Corvallis, Hwy 34 becomes Harrison Blvd. Remain on Harrison through Corvallis to 53rd Street. Turn south (left) onto 53rd Street (Walnut Blvd. becomes 53rd at the light). Benton County Fairgrounds is approximately ¼ of a mile on the right.

Alternate route: As you approach Corvallis on Highway 34, do not cross the bridge into town, but turn LEFT at the light before the bridge; this takes you to the downtown bypass. Continue (west) to the light at 53rd Street (Bi-Mart will be on your left). Turn right (north) onto 53rd Street. Benton County Fairgrounds is approximately ½ of a mile on the left.

USDAA AGILITY TITLING PROGRAM

Two certification programs will be offered at this event: Championship and Performance. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance Program classes for which they are eligible; however, under NO circumstance may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class at this agility test (i.e. Standard at any level in both programs). Classes include Standard agility, Gamblers, Jumpers, Pairs Relay and Snooker agility as set forth in Chapters 3-7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations, each of which are conducted at three competitive levels.

CHAMPIONSHIP DOG AGILITY PROGRAM

The Starters Standard classes shall be for dogs that have not earned the *Agility Dog®* title or a Starters Standard title. Starters non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have not earned a title in the class being entered (Starters Gamblers, Starters Jumpers, Starters Relay-3 different partners required-or Starters Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Advanced or Masters level. Three qualifying scores in the Standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Agility Dog* title.

The Advanced Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Agility Dog®* title or a Starters Standard title. Advanced non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Agility Dog®* title or that have earned a title in the equivalent non-standard class at the Starters level, but have not earned the equivalent Advanced non-standard title or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Masters level. Three qualifying scores in the Standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Advanced Agility Dog* title.

The Masters Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Advanced *Agility Dog®* title or the Advanced Standard title. Masters non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the Advanced *Agility Dog®* title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Masters non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

PERFORMANCE DOG AGILITY PROGRAM

Generally, Performance Level I, Level II and Level III are run on courses used for Starters, Advanced and Masters classes in the Championship Program, with the following exceptions: the A-frame is set at 5'6", jump heights are one height class lower as set forth in Notes to Competitors, no spread hurdles are utilized, and time standards in the Standard and Jumpers classes are extended by 3 seconds beyond that utilized in the Championship Program. Eligibility is determined as follows:

The Performance I Standard classes shall be for any dog that has not earned the Performance Dog ISM title, the Performance Standard I title, or a qualifying score in the Performance II or Performance III Standard classes. Performance I non-standard classes shall be for any dog that has not earned a title in the class being entered (Performance I Gamblers, Performance I Jumpers, or Performance I Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Performance II or Performance III level. Three qualifying scores in the Standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the non-standard classes is required to earn the Performance Dog ISM title.

The Performance II Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the Performance Dog ISM title, the Performance Standard I title, the *Agility Dog®* title or the Veteran *Agility Dog*SM title, but has not earned the Performance Dog IISM title or Performance Standard II title, or a qualifying score in the Performance III standard class. Performance II non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the Performance Dog ISM title, the *Agility Dog®* title or a title in the equivalent Starters or Performance I non-standard class, but not having earned a title in the equivalent non-standard Performance II class or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard Performance III class. Three qualifying scores in the Standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the Performance Dog IISM title.

The Performance III Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the Performance Dog IISM title, the Performance Standard II title, the Advanced *Agility Dog*SM title, or the Veteran Advanced *Agility Dog*SM title. Performance III non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the Performance Dog IISM title, the Advanced *Agility Dog®* title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced or Performance II level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Performance non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance programs at this event. A dog may be entered in any program for which it is eligible and may enter a Championship program class and Performance program class at the same level (e.g. Masters Gamblers and PIII Standard); however a dog may not be entered in the same or similar CLASS in both Championship and Performance (e.g. Masters Gamblers and PII or PIII Gamblers). In each of the following descriptions, it can be assumed that the Performance Program parallels the Championship program unless otherwise noted.

- **Standard Agility:** A standard agility course consists of a numbered sequence of obstacles. It demonstrates a dog/handler team's speed, accuracy, and teamwork. All non-standard classes are scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 3-5 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

Non-standard Class Descriptions - These non-standard classes are scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 & 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

- **Gamblers Class:** consists of a course with no pre-determined route and each obstacle is assigned a point value. In the 'opening' period the handler seeks to accumulate points by performing the obstacles of his / her choice in the time allotted. At the conclusion of the 'opening' the handler attempts the 'gamble', as a sequence designated by the judge to be handled from a distance, for additional points.

- **Jumpers Class:** consists of a course of jumps and may include a tire and tunnels.

- **Snooker Class:** has an 'opening' sequence of point collection similar to the Gamblers followed by a closing sequence of a set pattern. Roughly parallels the billiards game of 'Snooker', requiring the dog to successfully complete a 'red' jump prior to attempting an obstacle designated as any other color.

- **Pairs Relay:** consists of a standard course with one dog and handler running a portion of the course, followed by a baton exchange to a second handler and dog who run the second portion of the course. Partners must be from the same level and height division, mini (Ch 12/16", Perf 8/12") or open (Ch 22/26", Perf 16/22"). In the event only one dog is entered in a program/level, un-entered dogs or dogs from another program/level may NOT be recruited to form a qualifying pair. Relay is required at all levels for Performance.

JUNIOR HANDLER TITLING PROGRAM – Use separate entry form!

The Junior Handler Program is for children 18 years of age and younger. Four progressive levels of competition are offered. Each Junior Handler must separately register with their dog (see registration form) to be eligible for entry in the following classes. A dog may not compete with two different handlers in the same class level on the same day. Since the 2 runs per class per level are being offered on the same day, back to back, there will be no move-ups allowed as per USDAA® rules. Jump heights are the same as for the Performance Program: 8", 12", 16", 22". As described in Section 8.2 of the current USDAA rule book, classes offered are:

- **Beginners Agility Class:** The JH - Beginners AgilitySM certificate requires completion of one round of competition with no penalties. Entrants must complete an eight to ten question examination, and items missed on the exam must be reviewed prior to or during the judge's briefing. Completion of the course within the designated time without fault shall result in the award of USDAA's JH - Beginners Agility certificate of accomplishment. The obstacle course shall be comprised of ten (10) obstacles set in a simple horse shoe or simple "M" design, including an A-Frame (apex at 4'6"), Table at 12" for all dogs (to be performed in the down position for five cumulative seconds), Pipe Tunnel, Collapsed Tunnel and Six Hurdles (wings, if any, should be no more than 18" in width). The standard course time shall be 60 seconds. Dogs may compete on leash using a buckle collar. Election to do so must be designated on the entry form.

- **Elementary Agility Class:** The JH - Elementary AgilitySM certificate requires completion of two rounds of competition with no penalties. Successful completion of the two rounds will earn the JR - Elementary Agility certificate of accomplishment. The obstacle course shall be comprised of ten obstacles set in a simple horseshoe or simple "M" design. The same agility obstacles and related modifications shall be used as in the Beginners class, except that the A-frame shall measure 5'0" at the apex. The standard course time shall be the same as in the Beginners class, set at 60 seconds. Dogs may wear a buckle collar, but must compete off leash.

- **Intermediate Agility Class:** The JH - Elementary AgilitySM class requires three rounds of competition with no penalties. Dogs completing three clear rounds in this class shall be awarded the JH - Intermediate Agility certificate of accomplishment. The courses shall be of simple design, being slightly more challenging than a figure of "8", and shall include twelve (12) to fourteen (14) obstacles, including an A-Frame (apex at 5'6"), Dog Walk (elevation at no more than 3'0" and planks of no less than 7'0" in length), Pipe Tunnel, Collapsed Tunnel, Short set of weave poles (five or six), Table at 12" for dogs jumping in the lower two height classes and at 16" for dogs jumping in the two higher jump height classes (to be performed in the down position for five consecutive seconds), Long Jump, Tire Jump and four to six hurdles. The standard course time shall be 75 seconds. Dogs must compete off leash without a collar.
- **Senior Agility Class:** The JH - Senior AgilitySM class requires three rounds of competition with no penalties. Dogs completing three rounds without fault in this class level shall be awarded the JH - Senior Agility certificate of accomplishment. The courses shall be of simple design, being slightly more challenging than a figure of "8", and shall include thirteen (13) to fifteen (15) obstacles, including the same obstacles as in the JH - Intermediate class with the following modifications: A-frame apex at approximately 5'10" effective March 30, 2007 (5'6" for the 8" and 12" height classes) and the addition of a see-saw. The standard course time shall be computed at the rate of two yards per second not to exceed 75 seconds. Dogs must compete off lease without a collar.

CHAMPIONSHIP and PERFORMANCE JUMP HEIGHTS

Following are the jump heights for the Championship Program with Performance Program and Junior Handler heights in parentheses:

<u>Dog Height</u>	<u>Jump Height</u>	<u>Long Jump</u>	<u>Table**</u>
Over 21"	26" (22")	60" (48")	24" (16")
21" or less	22" (16")	48" (36")	24" (16")
16" or less	16" (12")	36" (24")	16" (12")
12" or less	12" (8")	20" (12")	12" (12")

NOTE: Effective March 30, 2007, the A-frame is set as follows: For dogs entered in Championship classes at 22" and 26" jump heights, the apex of the A-frame is approximately 5'10" (at a 99 degree angle). For dogs entered in Championship classes at 12" and 16" jump heights, and for all dogs entered in Performance program classes, the apex is approximately 5'6" (at a 104 degree angle). Because of minor variations in construction standards and terrain, the angle measurement at the apex of the A-frame shall overrule the height measurement when setting the A-frame in accordance with these regulations.

** See Junior Handler Program class descriptions for table heights used at each level.

GRAND PRIX OF DOG AGILITY® CHAMPIONSHIPS - LOCAL QUALIFIER

Description: USDAA's 2009 Grand Prix of Dog Agility® is designed to showcase top competitors in the sport of dog agility and to name an annual world champion. All competitors are eligible to compete with any dog, without regard to previous accomplishments. The tournament is structured on three levels, offering local qualifiers, regional championships and an overall world championship event. The tournament will include more than one hundred fifty local qualifying and regional championship events leading to the annual world championship event.

The tournament qualification season shall run from September 19, 2008 through September 14, 2009. Six or seven Regional Championships will be held in select cities from May through September, with each event consisting of two rounds - a semifinal round in which all pre-qualified entrants compete to earn a slot in the final round. The Grand Prix of Dog Agility World Championship event is to be held in conjunction with the Cynosport® World Games in the fall on a date following the end of the tournament season at a location to be determined and will consist of a quarterfinals, semifinals and final round for this tournament.

Scoring: USDAA® Official Rules & Regulations currently in effect at the date of competition shall apply. The following additional rules shall apply:

- Standard scoring rules for the Masters standard agility class as set forth in Chapter 3 of USDAA rules and regulations shall apply, except that standard course times shall range from 3.50 to 3.75 yards per second for competitors entered in the 22" and 26" classes, and 2.85 to 3.05 yards per second if entered in the 12" height class, and 3.10 to 3.40 yards per second if entered in the 16" height class. Results for second round of Regional Championships or in the World Championship event shall not be applied toward calculation of agility certification titles.
- Local Qualifying Trials consist of a single round on a standard course; a qualifying score is zero (0) faults. One qualifying score is required for entry to a Regional Grand Prix Championship, and two qualifying rounds (one of which may be earned in round 1 at a Regional Championship) are required for entry to the World Championship quarterfinals.
- First place winners earning a qualifying score at a local qualifier shall be awarded a voucher or ticket for a first-round bye at a Regional Championship at the jump height in which earned. The Qualifying Event First Place Voucher must be included with entry to the Regional Championship and are not reusable and will not be replaced if lost or destroyed. Qualifying Event Vouchers and byes earned at Regional Championships are nontransferable.
- All dogs entered that do not have a permanent registration card must be measured prior to competing at a Regional Championship or the Cynosport World Games. Should the dog be measured up, the competitor must jump their dog at the higher height, regardless of the height previously qualified. If a bye was earned at the lower height, it is forfeited, and the competitor must compete in any preliminary rounds that might have been foregone as a result of the bye.
- The six or seven Regional Championships are open to entry by anyone who has qualified for entry in any geographic region. These events are rated based upon the number of qualifying local events and the number of competitors eligible for entry in the geographic region. Both types of Regional Championships consist of two rounds, with competitors who earn zero faults in Round 1 advancing to Round 2 to compete against competitors who have earned Qualifying Event byes.
 - In a Type 1 Regional Championship, competitors placing within the top 50% of each height class in Round 2 with zero faults earn a "bye" in the World Championship quarterfinals (eligible to directly enter the semifinals). Competitors must place first with zero faults in each height class to be named Regional Champion and earn a bye in the World Championship quarterfinals. **There are no byes into the finals.**
 - In a Type 2 Regional Championship, the greater of the number of competitors placing within the top 50% or the top three competitors in Round 2, and have earned a zero fault qualifying score in both rounds shall earn a bye in the quarterfinals of the World Championships. Competitors who place first in each height class shall not earn a slot in the World Championship finals but shall carry the distinction as being the Regional Champion. Type 2 Regional Championships are held only in geographically isolated or developing regions where a sufficient number of supporting events or competitors are not being held to warrant a Type 1 Regional Championship event.
- Competitors who place within the top 50% of those entered in each jump height class in the World Championship quarterfinals with zero faults shall advance to the World semifinals, and competitors who place within the top 15% (maximum to be announced) of those entered in the semifinals with zero faults (including those who advance from the quarterfinals) earn the right to compete in the Finals.
- The dog earning zero faults and the fastest time shall be the winner. Should a tie of faults occur, the dog achieving that result in the fastest time is the winner. Should competitors have a tie of faults and time on course, a runoff shall be conducted on the same or similar course until a winner is determined.
- A competitor must be entered in a regional championship and/or the World Championship event (as applicable) in the same height class in which eligibility was earned, unless the dog is measured up as explained further in these tournament regulations.
- Where a competitor may earn qualifications in both the Championship Program tournaments and Performance Program tournaments throughout the tournament season, the competitor must enter the Championship Program tournaments at the Regional and World Championships unless a majority of qualifications from all qualifying tournaments have been earned in the Performance Program.
- A person may enter more than one dog in the tournament; however, no dog may be entered by more than one person and no dog may be entered in both the Championship and Performance Program tournaments at the same event.
- Any competitor may enter any of the local qualifying trials or regional championship events without regard to geographic location.
- No competitor, steward, judge or other show official shall be permitted to wear or exhibit in or about the ring any insignia of corporations or associations other than that of USDAA or its national and regional sponsors on the day of the tournament, without the express written permission of USDAA.
- Competitors must wear specified attire at all events. Such attire, if any, shall be set forth in the Agility Test Schedule for the event, or otherwise distributed at the event. No T-shirts are permitted in the main performance ring at the World Championship event; polo shirts are recommended and shirt-tails must be tucked-in in a neat manner. Similar attire should be worn in Regional championship final rounds.

Eligibility & Entry Rules: General Eligibility

Any competitor who has a dog registered with USDAA is eligible to compete. Competitors who reside outside North America and who have no access to sanctioned tournament qualification or Regional Championship events may be eligible for entry to the World Championship event based upon recognition of their performance results in recognized national or international tournaments or other events having met standards in competition as outlined below for eligibility for entry to the World Championship event quarterfinals below.

Foreign entrants seeking reciprocal recognition of overseas results are encouraged to submit their proof of eligibility in advance of entry to provide sufficient time for validation, and must register their dog with USDAA along with their entry to the Cynosport® World Games.

Awards

Qualifying ribbons and placement ribbons shall be offered for each local qualifier, regional championship and the Championships at the Cynosport World Games, as set forth in the Test Schedule for each event. The club hosting a regional championship shall assume responsibility for providing placement rosettes at their discretion to the winners in each jump height. USDAA will sponsor qualifying ribbons for each competitor earning a qualifying score. Qualifying ribbons will be awarded to those with a qualifying score in Round 1 of the Regional Championships. Semifinalist qualification rosettes shall be awarded to those with zero faults in the top 50% of the Regional Championship Finals. USDAA will provide a trophy for the regional champion named in each jump height who earns a score of zero faults. Ribbons and rosettes at events held outside North America shall be the responsibility of the host organization.

2009 PERFORMANCE NATIONAL STANDARDSM CHAMPIONSHIPS - LOCAL QUALIFIER

Description: USDAA's 2009 Performance National StandardSM is designed to showcase top competitors in the Performance Program and name a national champion. All competitors are eligible to compete with any dog, without regard to previous accomplishments. The tournament is structured on three levels, offering local qualifiers, regional championships and an overall championship event. The tournament will include more than one hundred fifty local qualifying and regional championship events leading to the annual championship event.

The tournament qualification season shall run from September 19, 2008 through September 14, 2009. Six or seven Regional Championships will be held in select cities from May through September, with each event consisting of two rounds - a semifinal round in which all pre-qualified entrants compete to earn a slot in the final round. The Performance National Standard Championship event is to be held in conjunction with the Cynosport® World Games in the fall on a date following the end of the tournament season at a location to be determined and will consist of a quarterfinals, semifinals and final round for each respective tournament.

Scoring: USDAA® Official Rules & Regulations currently in effect at the date of competition shall apply. The following additional rules shall apply:

- Standard scoring rules for the Masters standard agility class as set forth in Chapter 3 of USDAA rules and regulations shall apply, except that standard course times shall be applied utilizing time standards generally ranging from 3.30 yards per second to 3.55 yards per second for competitors in the 16" and 22" height classes, from 2.95 to 3.25 yards per second for competitors in the 12" height class and 2.75 to 2.95 yards per second in the 8" height class. Results for second round of Regional Championships or in the World Championship event shall not be applied toward calculation of agility certification titles.
- Local Qualifying Trials consist of a single round on a standard course; a qualifying score is zero (0) faults. One qualifying score is required for entry to a Regional Performance National Championship, and two qualifying rounds (one of which may be earned in round 1 at a Regional Championship) are required for entry to the Championship quarterfinals.
- First place winners earning a qualifying score at a local qualifier shall be awarded a voucher or ticket for a first-round bye at a Regional Championship at the jump height in which earned. The Qualifying Event First Place Voucher must be included with entry to the Regional Championship and are not reusable and will not be replaced if lost or destroyed. Qualifying Event Vouchers and byes earned at Regional Championships are nontransferable.
- All dogs entered that do not have a permanent registration card must be measured prior to competing at a Regional Championship or the Cynosport World Games. Should the dog be measured up, the competitor must jump their dog at the higher height, regardless of the height previously qualified. If a bye was earned at the lower height, it is forfeited, and the competitor must compete in any preliminary rounds that might have been foregone as a result of the bye.
- Six or seven Regional Championships are open to entry by anyone who has qualified for entry in any geographic region. These events are rated based upon the number of qualifying local events and the number of competitors eligible for entry in the geographic region. Both types of Regional Championships consist of two rounds, with competitors who earn zero faults in Round 1 advancing to Round 2 to compete against competitors who have earned Qualifying Event byes.

- In a Type 1 Regional Championship, competitors placing within the top 50% of each height class in Round 2 with zero faults earn a "bye" in the World Championship quarterfinals (eligible to directly enter the semifinals). Competitors must place first with zero faults in each height class to be named Regional Champion and earn a bye in the World Championship quarterfinals.

There are no byes into the finals.

- In a Type 2 Regional Championship, the greater of the number of competitors placing within the top 50% or the top three competitors in Round 2, and have earned a zero fault qualifying score in both rounds shall earn a bye in the quarterfinals of the Championships. Competitors who place first in each height class shall not earn a slot in the Championship finals but shall carry the distinction as being the Regional Champion. Type 2 Regional Championships are held only in geographically isolated or developing regions where a sufficient number of supporting events or competitors are not being held to warrant a Type 1 Regional Championship event.

- Competitors who place within the top 50% of those entered in each jump height class in the World Championship quarterfinals with zero faults shall advance to the World semifinals, and competitors who place within the top 15% (maximum to be announced) of those entered in the semifinals with zero faults (including those who advance from the quarterfinals) earn the right to compete in the Finals.
- The dog earning zero faults and the fastest time shall be the winner. Should a tie of faults occur, the dog achieving that result in the fastest time is the winner. Should competitors have a tie of faults and time on course, a runoff shall be conducted on the same or similar course until a winner is determined.
- A competitor must be entered in a regional championship and/or the Championship event (as applicable) in the same height class in which eligibility was earned, unless the dog is measured up as explained further in these tournament regulations.
- Where a competitor may earn qualifications in both the Championship Program tournaments and Performance Program tournaments throughout the tournament season, the competitor must enter the Championship Program tournaments at the Regional and World Championships unless a majority of qualifications from all qualifying tournaments have been earned in the Performance Program.
- A person may enter more than one dog in the tournament; however, no dog may be entered by more than one person and no dog may be entered in both the Championship and Performance Program tournaments at the same event.
- Any competitor may enter any of the local qualifying trials or regional championship events without regard to geographic location.
- No competitor, steward, judge or other show official shall be permitted to wear or exhibit in or about the ring any insignia of corporations or associations other than that of USDAA or its national and regional sponsors on the day of the tournament, without the express written permission of USDAA.
- Competitors must wear specified attire at all events. Such attire, if any, shall be set forth in the Agility Test Schedule for the event, or otherwise distributed at the event. No T-shirts are permitted in the main performance ring at the World Championship event; polo shirts are recommended and shirt-tails must be tucked-in in a neat manner. Similar attire should be worn in Regional championship final rounds.

Eligibility & Entry Rules: General Eligibility

Any competitor who has a dog registered with USDAA is eligible to compete.

Awards

Qualifying ribbons and placement ribbons shall be offered for each local qualifier, regional championship and the Championships at the Cynosport World Games, as set forth in the Test Schedule for each event. The club hosting a regional championship shall assume responsibility for providing placement rosettes at their discretion to the winners in each jump height in the semifinals (round 2). USDAA will sponsor qualifying ribbons for each competitor earning a qualifying score. Qualifying ribbons will be awarded to those with a qualifying score in Round 1 of the Regional Championships. Semifinalist qualification rosettes shall be awarded to those with zero faults in the top 50% of the Regional Championship Finals. USDAA will provide a trophy for the regional champion named in each jump height who earns a score of zero faults. Ribbons and rosettes at events held outside North America shall be the responsibility of the host organization.
